
We are the church

MEMBERS PRESENT: David Sharninghouse, Carol Cary, and Linda Ross. Devotions led by Linda. David volunteered to have May 22 devotions.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Reviewed and discussed. David noted the checking account balance listed of \$1130.18 was wrong. That amount was the net income for February. Remainder of report was correct. Carol moved and David 2nd to accept this report. All agreed and motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Reviewed and discussed. Linda moved and David 2nd to accept this report. All agreed and motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS: 2024 Adult Vacation Bible School (AVBS) dates at St. John's are July 16, 17, 18 (Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday) from 6 pm – 8 pm. We are in discussion with Robin Kershner for the Gideon's to provide the program. At this time, the plan is to continue as last year's evening schedule. Still working on the theme, possible Outreach.

-David notes no new progress with Synod in our search for a pastor. The Call Committee is continuing their contact effort.

- Carol reports the Easter Breakfast and Holy Week service donations totaled \$290, so she added \$110 from the Mile of Pennies Fund to make the amount needed to donate \$200 each to Lutheran Social Services and CHOPIN Hall.

-Carol notes our McComb EDO membership is due. Last year we sent \$150. Dave moved and Linda 2nd to continue this. All agreed and motion passed. She notes the McComb buildings downtown are continuing to be in the rehab process.

NEW BUSINESS: Pastor Elizabeth Hadler has accepted a pastoral position at a Findlay church and the April 14 church service will be her last one she will lead for us and St. Luke's. SAM Bob Fett will continue to lead our services on the Sundays he is available, April 21 & 28. Synod will be contacted for further pastoral assistance in leading our Sunday services.

- Carol reports she received the McComb Cookie Festival sponsorship notice which we did donate \$500 in 2023. This was discussed and decided it was a worthy community effort to support. David moved and Carol 2nd to donate \$500 to this effort. All agreed and motion passed.

Call Committee Update

The Call Committee has been meeting and has now completed the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) which was approved by both church councils in late March. The document, along with several additional documents were uploaded to the ELCA website and approved by the Bishop. Now we wait.

The committee, along with the Church Council Presidents, met with Call Committee facilitators Paul Brooks and Tom Ritter on April 18th for an orientation about conducting an interview. We learned how this is a "call" not a typical hiring of an employee. The committee has set dates in May to meet to discuss the questions we will ask of a candidate as well as discuss possible questions a candidate may want to ask us.

The important part of this process is confidentiality with regard to possible candidates. Please know that the committee is bound to this confidentiality for a number of reasons so we will **not** be able to discuss who we may be meeting with or any particulars of the interview. When the committee finds a candidate that we feel will be a good fit for our congregations we will share that with the councils. They may also interview or meet the candidate and if everyone, including the candidate, agrees that this is a good match, a vote will be asked of the congregations. At that time we will be able to share the candidate with the congregations. You have entrusted us with this task and we are taking our role in finding a new pastor seriously. The Holy Spirit is guiding us in our work.




