



PROPHETIC READING

ISAIAH 25:1-9

Reader: LORD, you are my God; I will honor you and praise your name.

ALL: You have done amazing things; you have faithfully carried out the plans you made long ago.

<u>Reader</u>: You have turned cities into ruins and destroyed their fortifications. The palaces which our enemies built are gone forever.

ALL: ALL: The people of powerful nations will praise you; you will be feared in the cities of cruel nations.

<u>Reader</u>: The poor and the helpless have fled to you and have been safe in times of trouble.

ALL: You give them shelter from storms and shade from the burning heat.

<u>Reader</u>: Cruel enemies attack like a winter storm, like drought in a dry land.

ALL: But you, Lord, have silenced our enemies; you silence the shouts of cruel people, as a cloud cools a hot day.

<u>Reader</u>: Here on Mount Zion the LORD Almighty will prepare a banquet for all the nations of the world — a banquet of the richest food and the finest wine. Here he will suddenly remove the cloud of sorrow that has been hanging over all the nations. The Sovereign LORD will destroy death forever!

He will wipe away the tears from everyone's eyes and take away the disgrace his people have suffered throughout the world. The LORD himself has spoken.

When it happens, everyone will say, ALL: "He is our God! We have put our trust in him, and he has rescued us. He is the Lord! We have put our trust in him, and now we are happy and joyful because he has saved us."

PSALM READING PSALM 23

Reader: The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. ²He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. ³He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. ⁴Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. ⁵Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. ⁶Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

DISCIPLESHIP READING

PHILIPPIANS 4:1-9

<u>Reader</u>: So then, my friends, how dear you are to me and how I miss you! How happy you make me, and how proud I am of you! — this, dear friends, is how you should stand firm in your life in the Lord.

² Euodia and Syntyche, please, I beg you, try to agree as sisters in the Lord. ³ And you too, my faithful partner, I want you to help these women; for they have worked hard with me to spread the gospel, together with Clement and all my other fellow workers, whose names are in God's book of the living.

⁴ May you always be joyful in your union with the Lord. I say it again: rejoice!

⁵Show a gentle attitude toward everyone. The Lord is coming soon. ⁶Don't worry about anything, but in all your prayers ask God for what you need, always asking him with a thankful heart. ⁷And God's peace, which is far beyond human understanding, will keep your hearts and minds safe in union with Christ Jesus.

⁸ In conclusion, my friends, fill your minds with those things that are good and that deserve praise: things that are true, noble, right, pure, lovely, and honorable. ⁹ Put into practice what you learned and received from me, both from my words and from my actions. And the God who gives us peace will be with you.

*GOSPEL READING

MATTHEW 22:1-14

Jesus tells a parable indicating that the blessings of God's kingdom are available to all, but the invitation is not to be taken lightly.

<u>Leader</u>: There is good news for us this day and it comes to us from the Gospel of Matthew chapter 22. **ALL: Glory to you, O Lord.**

Leader: Jesus again used parables in talking to the people. ² "The Kingdom of heaven is like this. Once there was a king who prepared a wedding feast for his son. ³ He sent his servants to tell the invited guests to come to the feast, but they did not want to come. ⁴ So he sent other servants with this message for the guests: 'My feast is ready now; my steers and prize calves have been butchered, and everything is ready. Come to the wedding feast!' ⁵ But the invited guests paid no attention and went about their business: one went to his farm, another to his store, ⁶ while others grabbed the servants, beat them, and killed them. ⁷ The king was very angry; so he sent his soldiers, who killed those murderers and burned down their city. ⁸ Then he called his servants and said to them, 'My wedding feast is ready, but the people I invited did not deserve it. ⁹ Now go to the main streets and invite to the feast as many people as you find.' ¹⁰ So the servants went out into the streets and gathered all the people they could find, good and bad alike; and the wedding hall was filled with people.

¹¹ "The king went in to look at the guests and saw a man who was not wearing wedding clothes. ¹² 'Friend, how did you get in here without wedding clothes?' the king asked him. But the man said nothing. ¹³ Then the king told the servants, 'Tie him up hand and foot, and throw him outside in the dark. There he will cry and gnash his teeth.'"

¹⁴ And Jesus concluded, "Many are invited, but few are chosen."


I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen

From your Church Council:



The Church Council has had many discussions about installing a new entry door to our church. We have decided on the style and design that gives us the widest opening $-67\frac{1}{2}$ ". The new door will be a sliding automatic door which will open as you approach, very much like those at Walmart. We have decided to go with a local company – Toledo

Mirror and Glass – that will provide us with quick service when needed. The total cost of the new door will be roughly \$21,000, which includes the door, installation, and power for the door. Funds will come from the Memorial Fund and the Improvement Fund. We have set aside time at the Annual Congregational Meeting on November 12, for discussion and a vote from the members. If the vote passes, the door will be installed in Spring 2024. Any questions can be directed to any Church Council Member, or brought up at the Annual Meeting. At the heart of the reform movement was the gospel, the good news that it is by grace through faith that we are justified and set free.

Expensive Wedding. Expensive Grace.

On a recent reality TV show entitled *Wedding Wars*, engaged couples competed for a complete wedding wardrobe. The winning couple received the bride's dress and the groom's tuxedo as well as proper attire for their entire wedding party. The estimated cash value was \$30,000. Getting married is not cheap.



In today's gospel Jesus tells a parable about a wedding invitation, a banquet, and God's grace. Jesus teaches about a king who ultimately invites all people to a wedding banquet. At first this parable seems to portray a wide

open and gracious invitation to a wedding celebration. However, by the end it is hard not to feel sorry for the poor guy who gets a last-minute invitation but gets thrown out for not wearing the correct wedding duds! He apparently wasn't a winner on that era's counterpart of that reality TV show! Again, getting married is not cheap—but neither is grace.

Jesus tells this parable as a way of teaching us that receiving God's grace changes people. As Dietrich Bonhoeffer taught, God's grace is not cheap, it comes at a great cost upon the cross. Once we receive this costly grace, our lives are never the same. This grace compels us to act and calls us to bear fruit with our lives. Ultimately we are led to share this grace with others. To continue to live in the same way after receiving this gracious invitation is not an option. So what are we to do? We simply receive the gracious invitation to the banquet and find a changing room—it's time to live a new life.
