

JOHN 10:7-10

Each Sunday he spreads a feast before us amid the world's violence and war. Those who listen to Jesus are led to abundant life. We go forth to be signs of the resurrection and extend God's tender care to all creation.

<u>Leader</u>: God of all creation, all you have made is good.



<u>Leader</u>: God of resurrection and new life: pour out your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine


ALL: Grace this table with your presence. Reveal yourself to us in the breaking of the bread.



Leader: Please join me in the absolution,




