

GOD SPEAKS TO US

PROPHETIC READING

PSALM 50:7-15

<u>Reader</u>: "O my people, listen as I speak. Here are my charges against you, O Israel: I am God, your God!

- ⁸ I have no complaint about your sacrifices or the burnt offerings you constantly offer.
- ⁹ But I do not need the bulls from your barns or the goats from your pens.
- ¹⁰ For all the animals of the forest are mine, and I own the cattle on a thousand hills.
- ¹¹ I know every bird on the mountains, and all the animals of the field are mine.
- ¹² If I were hungry, I would not tell you, for all the world is mine and everything in it.
- ¹³ Do I eat the meat of bulls? Do I drink the blood of goats?
- ¹⁴ Make thankfulness your sacrifice to God, and keep the vows you made to the Most High.
- ¹⁵ Then call on me when you are in trouble, and I will rescue you, and you will give me glory."

Reader: Word of God, word of life. ALL: Thanks be to God.

ROMANS 4:13-25

Reader: That famous promise God gave Abraham—that he and his children would possess the earth—was not given because of something Abraham did or would do. It was based on God's decision to put everything together for him, which Abraham then entered when he believed. If those who get what God gives them only get it by doing everything they are told to do and filling out all the right forms properly signed, that eliminates personal trust completely and turns the promise into an ironclad contract! That's not a holy promise; that's a business deal. A contract drawn up by a hard-nosed lawyer and with plenty of fine print only makes sure that you will never be able to collect. But if there is no contract in the first place, simply a promise—and God's promise at that—you can't break it.

¹⁶ This is why the fulfillment of God's promise depends entirely on trusting God and his way, and then simply embracing him and what he does. God's promise arrives as pure gift. That's the only way everyone can be sure to get in on it, those who keep the religious traditions and those who have never heard of them. For Abraham is father of us all. He is not our racial father—that's reading the story backward. He is our faith father.

¹⁷⁻¹⁸ We call Abraham "father" not because he got God's attention by living like a saint, but because God made something out of Abraham when he was a nobody. Isn't that what we've always read in Scripture, God saying to Abraham, "I set you up as father of many peoples"? Abraham was first named "father" and then became a father because he dared to trust God to do what only God could do: raise the dead to life, with a word make something out of nothing. When everything was hopeless, Abraham believed anyway, deciding to live not on the basis of what he saw he couldn't do but on what God said he would do. And so he was made father of a multitude of peoples. God himself said to him, "You're going to have a big family, Abraham!"

¹⁹⁻²⁵ Abraham didn't focus on his own impotence and say, "It's hopeless. This hundred-year-old body could never father a child." Nor did he survey

Sarah's decades of infertility and give up. He didn't tiptoe around God's promise asking cautiously skeptical questions. He plunged into the promise and came up strong, ready for God, sure that God would make good on what he had said. That's why it is said, "Abraham was declared fit before God by trusting God to set him right." But it's not just Abraham; it's also us! The same thing gets said about us when we embrace and believe the One who brought Jesus to life when the conditions were equally hopeless. The sacrificed Jesus made us fit for God, set us right with God.

Reader: Word of God, word of life. ALL: Thanks be to God.

*GOSPEL READING

MATTHEW 9:9-13, 18-22

Though Jesus was devoutly Jewish and practiced his faith, he was criticized for eating with tax collectors and sinners—the religiously nonobservant. Jesus criticizes the self-righteous and reminds us that mercy is to be at the heart of our religious practices. God continues to be made known in those on the margins of society, like Matthew the tax collector and the hemorrhaging woman. As we gather each Lord's day we receive the healing that makes us well and sends us forth to be signs of God's mercy for the world.

<u>Leader</u>: There is good news for us this day and it comes to us from the Gospel of Matthew, chapter 9. **ALL: Glory to you, O Lord.**

<u>Leader</u>: As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at his tax collector's booth. "Follow me and be my disciple," Jesus said to him. So Matthew got up and followed him.

¹⁰ Later, Matthew invited Jesus and his disciples to his home as dinner guests, along with many tax collectors and other disreputable sinners. ¹¹ But when the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with such scum?"

¹² When Jesus heard this, he said, "Healthy people don't need a doctor—sick people do." ¹³ Then he added, "Now go and learn the meaning of this Scripture: 'I want you to show mercy, not offer sacrifices.' For I have come to call not those who think they are righteous, but those who know they are sinners."

¹⁸ As Jesus was saying this, the leader of a synagogue came and knelt before him. "My daughter has just died," he said, "but you can bring her back to life again if you just come and lay your hand on her."

¹⁹ So Jesus and his disciples got up and went with him. ²⁰ Just then a woman who had suffered for twelve years with constant bleeding came up behind him. She touched the fringe of his robe, ²¹ for she thought, "If I can just touch his robe, I will be healed."

²² Jesus turned around, and when he saw her he said, "Daughter, be encouraged! Your faith has made you well." And the woman was healed at that moment.

Leader: The gospel of the Lord. All: Praise to you, O Christ.



For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever and ever. Amen




*Spiritual Communion Prayer


