WE ARE BAPTIZED IN CHRIST JESUS

PRESENTATION FOR BAPTISM

<u>Leader</u>: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

<u>Leader</u>: Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have Oakley Christine Hoffman and Kimber Ellen Quinn Hoffman baptized into Christ?

Parents: I do.

Leader: As you bring Oakley and Kimber to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities: to live with them among God's faithful people, bring them to the Word of God and the Holy Supper, teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in their hands the holy scriptures, and nurture them in faith and prayer, so that they may, in time, learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

<u>Leader</u>: Do you promise to help Oakley and Kimber grow in the Christian faith and life?

Parents: I do.

<u>Leader</u>: Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Oakley and Kimber in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help them live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Sponsors: I do.

<u>Leader</u>: Will the congregation please rise. People of God, do you promise to support Oakley and Kimber and pray for them in their new life in Christ?

ALL: We do.

***PROFESSION OF FAITH**

<u>Leader</u>: I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God, and the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Parents and Sponsors: I renounce them.

Leader: Do you believe in God the Father?

ALL: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Leader: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

ALL: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Leader: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

ALL: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

***THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT**

Leader: The Lord be with you.

ALL: And also with you.

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

ALL: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Leader: We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. **ALL: Amen.**

*AN OFFERING OF CONFESSION


<u>Leader</u>: As we come to God in prayer, let us open ourselves to the presence of the Spirit, to bring our souls the freshness of mercy and grace.



DEUTERONOMY 5:12-15

<u>Reader:</u> Observe the sabbath day and keep it holy, as the LORD your God commanded you. ¹³Six days you shall labor and do all your work. ¹⁴But the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God; you shall not do any work— you, or your son or your daughter, or your male or female slave, or your ox or your donkey, or any of your livestock, or the resident alien in your towns, so that your male and female slave may rest as well as you. ¹⁵Remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the LORD your God brought

you out from there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm; therefore the LORD your God commanded you to keep the sabbath day.

<u>Reader:</u> Word of God, word of life. **ALL: Thanks be to God.**

PSALM READING

(responsively)

Psalm 81:1-10

<u>Reader:</u> Sing with joy to God our strength and raise a loud shout to the God of Jacob.

ALL: Raise a song and sound the timbrel, the merry harp, and the lyre.

<u>Reader:</u> Blow the ram's horn at the new moon, and at the full moon, the day of our feast;

ALL: for this is a statute for Israel, a law of the God of Jacob.

<u>Reader:</u> God laid it as a solemn charge upon Joseph, going out over the land of Egypt, where I heard a voice I did not know:

ALL: "I eased your shoulder from the burden; your hands were set free from the gravedigger's basket.

<u>Reader:</u> You called on me in trouble, and I delivered you; I answered you from the secret place of thunder and tested you at the waters of Meribah.

ALL: Hear, O my people, and I will ad monish you: O Israel, if you would but listen to me!

<u>Reader:</u> There shall be no strange god among you; you shall not worship a foreign god.


ALL: I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt. Open your mouth wide, and I will fill it.

Reader: Word of God, word of life. ALL: Thanks be to God.

SECOND READING

<u>Reader:</u> We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. ⁷But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. ⁸We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; ⁹persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; ¹⁰always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. ¹¹For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. ¹²So death is at work in us, but life in you.

Reader: Word of God, word of life. ALL: Thanks be to God.



*GOSPEL READING

MARK 2:23-3:6

Jesus challenges the prevailing interpretation of what is lawful on the sabbath and tells his critics that the sabbath was made for humankind, not the other way around. Healing the man with the withered hand is work that cannot wait until the next day.

Leader: The holy gospel according to Mark. ALL: Glory to you, O Lord.

<u>Leader</u>: One sabbath Jesus was going through the grainfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. ²⁴The Pharisees

said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?" ²⁵And he said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? ²⁶He entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions." ²⁷Then he said to them, "The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath; ²⁸so the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath."

^{3:1}Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand. ²They watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so that they might accuse him. ³And he said to the man who had the withered hand, "Come forward." ⁴Then he said to them, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. ⁵He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. ⁶The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him.




Sharing the Good News - not just for Sundays!
