








A Reflection from Pastor Rob

Thank you for welcoming me into your lives and ministry!

October 1, my last Sunday with you all, will mark 33 months of ministry together.

When I arrived in January 2021, I was recording worship on Saturdays and doing counseling sessions over ZOOM calls.

Now, not only are we back to in-person worship, we have started the conversation on how, together, St. Luke's and St. John's can build a pastoral call together.

I am proud of the work you are doing to figure out what God's future will be. Discernment is not - and has not always been - easy.

Not long ago, Janet Goldner shared her reflections on the changes we have seen, particularly since emerging from pandemic lockdowns. Janet was looking through church archives, particularly during the Depression years. At that time, council members worried that people were not attending worship; they were worried that they couldn't meet their budget; they worried how long their church would stay open.

In thinking about this, Janet has reminded me that we've been here before. And, we have survived.

My prayer for you is that you do not fall into the trap that your best days are behind you. To the contrary, I think your best days are ahead of you, even if they are uncertain. Your compassion for one another; your desire to bring the best out of your community; and your faithfulness in the midst of struggle are strengths. Do not count yourselves out.

If I have any advice to give it would be to resist the temptation to build silos. In other words, St. John's and St. Luke's will do better if you mutually help one another, rather than save yourselves separately. Building each other up plays into your strengths. With the Spirit's help, see yourselves as a parish who brings good news not only to North Baltimore and McComb separately, but also to one another and everyone in between.

October is Reformation Month

On Halloween of 1517, a German monk named Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of Wittenberg Church. These 95 expressed Theses his concerns over corruption found in the Catholic church. One of his primary concerns was the church selling "indulgences" to people in order to release them from having to serve penitence for their sins. An act which he considered to be people trying to buy their way into heaven. This act opened up a debate with religious scholars of the time that eventually lead to the Protestant Reformation.

Let us no just reflect on the history of Protestantism on Reformation Day (October 31) but the entire Reformation Month. Let us remember that we are not just a reformed church, but a church that is constantly reforming while holding on to the love, grace and the mighty power of our God.

Fall 2023: "Holy places," a three-session Bible study by the Rev. Dr. Meghan Johnston Aelabouni



Physical places often shape our identities, relationships and faith. "Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it," Paul writes. Part of what this means is that faith doesn't just reside in our thoughts or emotions. Faith resides in our whole bodies, and how our bodies "live and move and have our being" in the sacred places where God encounters us. In this Fall 2023 Gather Bible study, written by an ELCA missionary living in Jerusalem, we'll explore what holy places mean, not

only for the Holy Land of the Bible, but for each of us, wherever we may be.
