

Is God telling us to go back to "normal"?

And [the men from Emmaus] worshiped Jesus and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple blessing God. Luke 24:52-53

When Jesus and the disciples had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to Jesus, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." John 21:15

Years ago, there was a tornado warning issued for my neighborhood. I was doing yard work when the storm hit. When the sirens blared, I stopped my work and went to the basement. An hour later, after the storm cleared and the sun emerged, I went right back to my work.

It was a different story for the disciples of Jesus after this crucifixion. After Jesus died and was buried, the disciples had to figure out what to do. Cleopas and his friend tried to go back to their hometown, Emmaus. Peter, the fisherman, tried fishing again in Galilee.

But, try as they might, they couldn't do it. They couldn't go back to normal.

Peter, Cleopas, and the other disciples spent three years with Jesus. Not only had they learned new skills, they were changed by the experience. Without Jesus, Peter claimed he was a fisherman again. And yet, when Jesus returned, **Peter realized he was destined for something new and different** than fishing. Peter, Cleopas, and the other disciples tried to "go back to normal", but they had been **forever changed by their three years with Jesus**.

We are now three years since the pandemic lockdowns began in 2020. And, like the disciples after Jesus' resurrection, we are faced with the question, "What now?"

We can try like Peter and the others to go back to normal. We can try to do what comes easiest to us; what feels comfortable after three years of COVID-19.

But returning to normal after a pandemic is not the same as going back to yard work after a tornado warning. Unlike the warning, which turned out to be a temporary disruption, everyone of us reading this article has been changed by the pandemic. Further, if you don't feel you have changed personally, you certainly sense changes in the people and in the world around you.

Going back to normal is impossible because our world has changed.

Easter is our annual reminder that God calls us into something deeper and more meaningful than "getting back to normal." If anything, Jesus is not normal. Rather than avoid the changes brought on by the pandemic, **the Resurrection of Jesus is a necessary reminder that, out of death comes new life.** A seed cannot grow without the soil being broken.

Despite all we have been through in the pandemic, what new opportunities do you think we have as a church to grow new life in the community?

Lutherans Restoring Creation worship service


