# A Reflection from Pastor Rob

#### Pastoral Call Survey: How much time do we need from a pastor?

During the month of March 2023, both congregations took a survey to help congregational leadership better understand your views on needs we have for a pastor and the future.

Last month, I talked about **A NEW KIND OF CHURCH**. This month, I will reflect on **HOW MUCH TIME DO WE NEED FROM A PASTOR?** 

The survey we completed around Easter time asked what role the next pastor should play in congregational life and how much time the pastor is needed.

Congregati on	The pastor should be the primary decision-maker	The pastor should share decision-making	The pastor should only support the decisions of leaders	The pastor should serve FULL time	The pastor should serve <b>PART</b> time
St. Luke's	4	17	7	26	6
St. John's	1	9	1	1	9

In general, survey participants in both congregations understand that the pastor should share in decision-making with church councils, committees, and other leadership teams.

However, there is a distinct difference in attitudes about full time vs. part time work. St. Luke's overwhelmingly seeks a full time pastor. By contrast, St. John's seeks a part time pastor.

Under the arrangement with Pastor Ralph, St. John's is an additional mission to St. Luke's. During my work as a transitional pastor, I have approached the work as co-equal mission (St. Luke's handles the call paperwork and compensation).



As you think about the kind of support and time your congregation needs, here are some benefits to having a part time or a full time pastor.

#### Benefits of a part time pastor:

- we, the members, take on greater ownership of the congregation's vision and mission
- we spend less money on administrative costs to run the church
- we give the pastor permission to focus on only 2 or 3 areas of ministry that will benefit our congregation the most

#### Benefits of a full time pastor:

- we feel secure that our church is whole pastor, building, and members
- we have a pastor who is present in all of our church and member activities
- the pastor can fill in or do tasks that members can't or won't volunteer for

What are some benefits you think come with a part time pastor? What are some benefits you think come with a full time pastor?







#### **MUTUAL MINISTRY TEAM**

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

- Clay handed out 2 estimates for new sliding doors.
  - o Stanley Access Technologies \$12,000 (sliding doors like you see at Walmart)
    - Bi-Part Sliding Door
    - 48" opening
  - o Toledo Mirror & Glass Automated Entrance Technology \$17,620 (Toledo, Ohio)
    - 3-Panel Telescoping Door
    - 67-1/2" opening
  - o Estimates do not include getting power to the door.
  - o We all agreed that the door with the larger opening would be best.
  - o If this project takes place, funding would come from the memorial fund and improvement fund.
  - o Clay will talk to Toledo Mirror & Glass for additional information.
- Installing a Knox Box will be put on hold until after new doors would be installed.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- Beth Williams came to council prior to the meeting advising us that Laura Vitt, owner of NB Nutrition, is looking for a new place to hold her cardio drumming classes each week beginning July 1<sup>st</sup>. Laura will be soon working full-time so she doesn't want the continued expense to rent the building on Main St where her cardio drumming classes are currently held. Laura asked Beth if it would be possible to use St Luke's Lutheran Church for her weekly drumming classes (3-5 per week), so Beth told her she would ask St Luke's council. Council then discussed this matter during their meeting. There was a Motion by JoLynn to not allow Laura to hold her drumming classes at St Luke's, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Clay, and after a majority vote, the Motion passed.
- Clay advised that it's been 7 years since Morlock has repaved our parking lot & patched potholes, etc., and it now needs some attention again. Bryant will contact Morlock to inquire.
