Winter/Spring 2024 Bible study: "Scripture and nature: Teachers of faith" by the Rev. Sara Olson-Smith

As we prepare for the new year, we invite you into 2024: The Year of Rest. Time and time again God calls us into rest through scripture. We read stories of Jesus retreating into the hills, journeys being paused, and creation being celebrated with rest.

Throughout 2024 we will explore this question, not just through sleep or vacation time, but through little moments each day that nourish and renew us.
