

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, February 14



Ash Wednesday is important because it marks the start of the Lenten period leading up to Easter, when Jesus was resurrected. The ashes symbolize both death and repentance. During this period, Christians show repentance and mourning for their sins, because they believe Christ died for them. On Ash Wednesday we will offer a soup and sandwich meal at 6:00 p.m. followed by worship at 7:00 p.m. to include imposition of ashes. Continuing each Wednesday through the Season of Lent (March 20) we will have soup and sandwiches at 6:00 p.m. followed by a Lenten Bible study at 7:00 p.m. Watch the Sunday bulletins and your email for announcement of the study theme and materials. Plan now to join us as we journey through Lent together.

Winter/Spring 2024 Bible study: "Scripture and nature: Teachers of faith" by the Rev. Sara Olson-Smith It's not too late to join in!

Jesus regularly invokes nature in his teaching, drawing us into deeper relationship with the created world. But it's not just Jesus inviting us to see creation as teacher and kin. The scriptures themselves help us see the important role of the created world in God's
