# We can do it!

Fall is here! The time has changed, the temperature has changed, we actually had some frost Saturday. Don't you just love the seasons? In Ohio we can say, if you don't like the weather wait 20 minutes. Isn't change wonderful? It brings new clothing, new colors, new habits, new life, I embrace change, how about you? If we look around and observe we will find that change is constant, in almost everything. God and his endless grace and love do not change, however our perspective on God does, we change. One of the ways we may change is in hearing or reading the Bible. The Bible is all about our (human) perspective changing, of seeing and experiencing God, growing and trusting, failing and repenting. There are a lot of events that have been included in our 66 books. I never counted all of the events nor do I feel the need but it's important to be exposed to them.

You may have noticed that since September we have been doing these rather long Old Testament readings and that the sermon will often focus on those. What is going on? CHANGE!!!!! In our beloved ELCA Lutheran Church we have options. Options for our order of worship, options as to music, options for our prayers and options for our lectionary. These options work with times of the year, local traditions and current needs. The lectionary, what Bible books and verses we work with on any given Sunday, is actually on a cycle. The prior one, the standard lectionary, was an A B C, 3-year cycle so that every 3 years you were hearing the same readings... again. This lectionary has been in use since the early 60s. About 20 years ago a new lectionary was approved, a narrative lectionary. It begins in September with the Old Testament and goes through the Bible, not jumping around, and then in December we get into the New Testament. There are so many wonderful stories and events, parables and lessons that we have heard before or maybe not. In the ABC standard lectionary we were hearing the same events, stories over and over, which is wonderful, however what about all those other stories, lessons and parables that were not included in those readings? One is not more valuable that the other. In an effort to focus on areas that we were not hearing on a regular basis I proposed a change to the church council

and they agreed to proceed. The narrative lectionary is a 1-2-3-4-year cycle so you will hear the same things less often.

I can sense your look, so if these are on a cycle, the same books, same verses every 3 or 4 years, is a pastor or SAM going to recycle their sermons? Maybe. When you read a portion of the bible what sticks out to you? What speaks to you in that particular moment of your life? Now if we go back to those same verses 6 months later, we find it fresh because where we are in our life is not the same place, our focus, our situation, our needs are not the



same. Thats why we can recycle our readings and they will still be as if they are new, WE change. And even as we are created in Gods image and as Christ lives within each of us, we are still a stiff-necked people. We are a people with an inclination to sin. Jesus calls us to follow him, not ourselves, and not the things of this world. We are called to repent to turn around and go the other way. We are called to change. We are forgiven.

May the God of love who sent his son Jesus Christ for us, all of us, bless you in all your change.
