The real preparations though, that we should pay the most attention to as we hurry and bustle through our day, is at first not as visible. We need to prepare our hearts. All that outside stuff, the food, the decorations don't have any lasting purpose. I rather like **HOPE**, to have hope is a wonderful thing. Sometimes, well often really, as we look around, we see and experience things that don't seem right, they make us concerned and worried. Over 350 times in our Bible the words "fear not" ring out. God has a plan to prosper us, not to harm us, do we trust that? Do we have hope in God?

We can take **FAITH** for granted, I go to church or I consider myself a Christian, is that faith? Or can that be like putting up the decorations, looks good, but.... I had a relative that kept a bowl of plastic apples on a table, looked good, never spoiled, just dust them once in a while. When I visited as a kid I would gaze at them and wonder.... why. You see my grandparents had an orchard and any fruit you saw in that house was the real deal and anybody was welcome to eat it. I could never wrap my head fully around the fake fruit. Our preparations for the coming season need to be real as well, not something that looks good but holds no nourishment for others. We need to walk with God daily, to grow in our faith, read the Bible, pray, and wrestle with the words and their meanings.

Which leads me to **LOVE**. God loves us and it's a well so deep it doesn't have a bottom. And just like my grandparents who shared their fruit with those who asked, God shares his love with us. Our task then becomes passing that love to others, not because we have to but because our hope and our faith coupled with an unbounded amount of love that flows to us, flows out to others. Feed the hungry, cloth the naked, care for the widow

and orphan, tend to the sick, declare Gods love for the world and all peoples.

Those are the decorations that God wants to see as we prepare for this season. To us a child is born. Amen


The first day of Advent this year is November 30th and the advent season ends on Christmas day. Between those times there are things to do to prepare for Jesus' birth. There

feels something special about going home for Christmas. I know that Christmas is a month away but I want to encourage everyone to make an effort to come home to your church for Christmas. We are a


