

Property Committee Report

 - o Front Door
 - The inspection of our new front door failed. The orange extension cord running from the dedicated outlet needs to be visible to the bulk head of the door. Simple fix. After the emergency exit function was used (pushing the doors outward to exit), it wouldn't re-latch and close. Rick will take care of arranging the door getting fixed per the failed inspection.
 - Wood County Committee on Aging
 - Must receive the certificate of occupancy before the WCCA senior meals begin, and as long as the health department inspection takes place after our door issues are fixed, the senior meals will begin on Monday, February 3, 2025.

- Motion by Pam to appoint Rick VanMooy as the communication liaison between St. Luke's and Wood County Committee on Aging. 2nd by Bryant. All approved.
- Pam will let WCCA know that they can use the bulletin board outside our meeting room and they can use our TV when needed.
- A mailbox will need to be made for the Wood County Committee on Aging (replace the Lost & Found mailbox).
- We need to make sure there is good communication with WCCA as far as letting them know ASAP if there is a funeral and/or funeral dinner scheduled so they know not to come that day.
- Rick and Bryant discussed the parking bumpers for our new trash dumpster. Bryant will send Clay what he needs to get the necessary supplies ordered. Does a pad still need to be poured under the new trash dumpster, as previously discussed, since it will soon be used for licensed food?
- It was discussed that we need to have a bucket of salt available to be used when there's ice around and ice forms between snow removal jobs. Bryant will take care of this.
