

News flash Lent is upon us

We all have experiences with this thing we call Lent. In the Latin, it's Quadragesima (fortieth). Hmm...forty...lent is forty days long. Jesus prayed for 40 days in the wilderness. It rained for forty days in Noah's time. The exodus was forty years. Lent is derived from the Anglo-Saxon word 'lectin' meaning spring, and from the West Germanic 'langitinaz' meaning long days. For us it is the forty days leading up to Easter when we are called to reflect, to pray, and to dig into ourselves as we dig into God. When Jesus went into the wilderness to pray, he fasted. His focus was on preparing, just like we are, for his rejection by the human race, us. Jesus fasted because fasting clears the mind, actually allowing you to think better, to be more aware. He then prayed, questioning his future and the horrors that lie in wait. He wrestled with the devil. He wrestled with his faith, and he questioned God – isn't there another way? Have you ever wrestled with God? That is what Lent is for.




