Holy Week and Easter



In the Lutheran Church Holy Week is the most important celebration in our church year. It is a time of reflection. It is a

sad reminder of cruelty of man and yet it turns into a joyous day when our sins were wiped away and we were reborn in Christ's resurrection! Palm Sunday, April 13, begins our Holy Week. We will have our regular church service at 10:15 a.m. We will remember Jesus' arrival into Jerusalem to Hosannas and waving palm branches. On Thursday evening, April 17, at 7 p.m. we will celebrate Maundy Thursday with Holy communion and the stripping of the altar. We will also reflect on Good Friday as part of this service. On Easter morning, April 20, we will join together for an Easter breakfast and fellowship at 9 a.m. Our Celebration of the Resurrection will begin at 10:15 a.m. Although our services are broadcast, we urge everyone to come and celebrate with us together.



Spring Cleaning

As part of our Easter tradition the church and



especially the altar area of the sanctuary are cleaned and polished and returned to their places after the stripping of the altar during the Maundy Thursday

service. The Altar Guild is inviting everyone to come to the church on Saturday, April 19, 2025 at 9:30 a.m. to help with this task. There are simple tasks like putting out the new vestments, cleaning the communion ware, dusting the baseboards and window sills, and wiping down the pews. Karen Kraus anticipates with entire job will take less than 2 hours. Many hands make light work and the process is a fun time of fellowship.

Talents to Share

you hid them or used them to help others. Of course, we learned in Sunday School that we were supposed to share our talents, those gifts that each of us have been given! Recently we shared a

volunteer form that asked each of us to check off what tasks /committees we were willing to do for our church. We realize that everyone is busy and some people may be afraid to get up in front of everyone to speak or sing but there are all kinds of tasks, many behind the scenes, that need filling. Maybe you could take the recycling to the community bins twice a month, or staple bulletins, or sing in the choir, or fix a dish for a funeral dinner. Everyone has a talent that can be shared. If you have not completed the form pick one up on the table outside of the sanctuary. Once it is completed put it in the collection plate, place it on the table, or put it in Dana's mailbox.

SAM (Synod Approved Minister)

We have had the blessing of a couple of SAMs (Synod Approved Ministers) during our search for a pastor. These lay people have taken training and classes and have been given the right to do baptisms, funerals, communion, and weddings, even though they are not ordained ministers. Paul Brooks recently was recognized as a SAM and is coming to St. Luke's and St. John's under a yearlong contract that was approved by both Church Councils. His contract was approved during the March Council meeting. Not only will he be preaching 3 of 4 Sundays each month, he will also be ministering to the sick, having office hours to meet with members, and creating Bible Studies and other church activities. On the 3rd Sunday of each month when Paul is away, Ken Pollitz, an interim part-time minister at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in BG, will fill in. We are pleased to officially welcome Paul as our SAM at a special service which is being scheduled. Having a SAM does not mean that we are not still looking for a Pastor. The Call Committee is still waiting for the right candidate but we are pleased that Paul Brooks has been sent to us.
