It could be said that I have a special relationship with air conditioners. I also have a special relationship with my twin 8 yr old grandsons. They love to come and adventure with grandpa, be it in the woods, the creek, just outback eating whatever berry is ripe, or in the pool. They are boys and even if that pool were as big as a football field, I believe they would find each other and do minor violence on each other. Boys.... what ya



gonna do? So, one takes a swing at the other and I'm like "stop! what are you doing?" "He splashed in my eyes! Did you splash in his eyes? Well, he was in my way. You couldn't see he was there? He grabbed my arm a while ago. Ok, everybody out of the pool, we need to talk." Drip, drip, drip, drip.

So, how wonderful would it be if our lives could be like that, everybody out of the pool, we need to talk. Are our lives really that much different from having two 8 yr old boys in the pool? I bet there were 8 yr old boys 6000 years ago that were not much different. When they saw another person steal something from their family, they probably saw their family go get the guilty party and beat him to within an inch of his life, if they didn't just kill him. Very, very primitive justice, well not really justice. This world was run by 8 yr old boys. Sometimes I wonder how far we have come. And then they get some nudges from God. "Hey everybody out of the pool! I'm going to give you folks some rules so we can actually move toward a little justice." Leviticus chapter 24, eye for an eye, tooth for a tooth, if someone steals or breaks something the offender must make it right.

We can hardly imagine the difference these "laws" made. It wasn't just wholesale violence anymore, there was some fairness, a little justice. Their perception of God was changing. So now all the 8 yr old boys had some rules and an authority figure. There are many people that still refer to the eye for an eye in defending what and how they do their lives. It's in the Bible, right? Down through time people have been trying to figure God out and they get stuck, stuck in the Old Testament, stuck in something

they learned in Sunday School, stuck in something that felt right. Jesus tells us of a new way, a way beyond the eye for an eye, a way to freedom from our having to make those judgements. Love your neighbor as yourself. Forgive others seventy times seven, turn the other cheek, pick up your cross and follow me. Get out of the pool of violence.

We are all like 8 yr old boys, we need to get out of the pool sometimes and go have a talk, or pray with Jesus and get reset. My grandsons, after a talk, asked if we could make smores. My reply was that the fire is already going and the supplies are just inside the house. They were very good. There's nourishment is Gods house as well, come on over and let's talk.

Service Project

St. Luke's will once again participate in a service project on God's Work, Our Hands Sunday, which is September 7, 2025. Each year the ELCA encourages its member congregations to reach out to their neighbors through a service project that is completed on a specific day. Because we believe that grace flows through us from Jesus Christ, this project is our way of sharing Jesus with our neighbors.

The Good News†Amen team will be spearheading our efforts for three projects this fall but the first will be completed on this special Sunday in September, after church. The project was discussed and approved by Church Council. We will be preparing "Thanksgiving Meal in a Bag", similar to our Birthday bags last year, for the local Food Pantry. Our goal is to prepare at least 25 bags. Each bag contains 2 small cans of turkey or chicken, 1 box of stuffing, 1 envelope of instant mashed potatoes, 1 packet of gravy mix, and 1 can of kernel corn (or seasoned green beans). A recipe for the dinner is also included but only water is needed to complete the dinner. Each bag feeds two people. A sample bag is on the rolling cart in Luther Hall. All donations can be placed on this cart. The sample bag only cost \$8 at Dollar Tree but you can also get items at Meijer, Kroger and Walmart. We will be collecting mashed potatoes and the can of corn during July. The rest of the items will be collected in August. If everyone donates a little bit, we can help so many others. It truly is "God's Work, Our Hands." Won't you help?



Unfinished Business

- St. Luke's Constitution Review & Update
 - Paul asked a question about Active & Inactive members and how they were determined in the past. This is something that the constitution review committee will address.
 - We are to look over the constitution and get our thoughts to Paul.
- Wood County Committee on Aging sign.
 - o Pam met with the Village Administrator about the WCCA sign. She is waiting to hear if our sign placement in the yard is approved. She will touch base with him this upcoming week.
- Sean Mills did the spring clean-up around the building and submitted a bill. Everyone agreed it looks good.
- We have done some clean up around the inside of the building starting with the choir room downstairs and the flower room, and a Sunday school room upstairs. We are working with Beth to organize and discard Bible school items/decorations that cannot be used anymore.
- Bryant will be getting estimates for the reconstruction of our church parking lot.
- Parking Lot Project Phase I
 - O Bryant spoke with someone from town who does concrete work about repairs/reconstruction of our West parking lot entrance/exit. He received an estimate of \$5,000 that will include the concrete approach and sidewalk. Bryant will also be getting some cold pack to fill the hole.
 - Motion by Clay to give Bryant permission to seek permits and enter into a contract to have this work done. 2nd by Matt. All approved.
 - o Motion by Matt to accept the \$5,000 bid for the work. 2nd by JoLynn. All approved.
- The remainder of the partitions will soon be taken down.

New Business

- There was an initial VBS meeting recently with 8 people present. Beth presented the theme and how it will be organized. She has a sign-up board posted for people to sign up and also register kids. We are going to need a lot of help. Simple suppers were discussed.
- A discussion about borrowing church folding tables & chairs came up recently. Pam was not aware that the policy had changed so the request was denied. The request to borrow folding tables & chairs by MEMBERS is permitted. The items borrowed must be written in the notebook under the mailboxes and items are to be returned asap after the event.

Pam will call and apologize to the person that asked to borrow them, and the policy will be put in our newsletter.

- The AED training will be held after church on June 15 by Derrick Wears.
- Rally Day will be September 7 with a dinner after church.
- Two (2) God's Work, our Hands projects were discussed and verbally approved. We will collect items for "dinner in a bag", and collect children's underwear and socks for Powell Elementary School. We will start the campaign soon, chaired by the Good News†Amen committee.
- Motion by Matt for council NOT to meet in July. 2nd by Bryant. All approved. If items of business come up, we will take care of it by text or email.
- Council was informed that Jack Sterling will be attending a retreat for church leaders soon at Sauder Village.
